Because we had to severely limit the amount of audience present, we wanted to give our dancer's relatives a way to still be physically connected to the dancers. Choreographers

Adam Hundt (COVidiom), a former GCB member born in Dayton, Ohio, is a teacher, director, choreographer and producer based in Ft. Lauderdale, FL Mr. Hundt most recently produced the West-End production of Grease for Royal Caribbean. He has also produced and directed multiple production shows as well as the DreamWorks Character Program. Mr. Hundt has been a member of BalletMet Columbus, Ballet Pacifica, American Repertory Ballet, Hubbard Street 2, BalletX and as a guest with Dominic Walsh Dance Theater and Infinite Movement. Before concluding his performance career he performed for Royal Caribbean Cruise Line's Freedom of the Seas, also serving as Dance Captain. He has studied with the San Francisco Ballet, BalletMet, Indiana University, and Barbara Pontecorvo in his hometown of Dayton. In addition to teaching for the Lou Conte Dance studio, Princeton Ballet School and BalletMet, he performed and taught for the International Contemporary Dance Festival in Poland and Lithuania. Mr. Hundt has choreographed multiple works for BalletMet, Ballet Pacifica, DanceWorks Chicago, and in 2006 was a fellowship recipient from the Greater Columbus Arts Council.

Molly McDonald (*Mellifluous Movement*) is a former member of Gem City Ballet. *Mellifluous Movement*, Ms. McDonald's first of two ballets created for GCB, was created as a part of GCB's Senior Choreography Project in 2010, and was the first such work to be accepted into the company's standard repertory.

Ms. McDonald now holds a BA in English with a minor in Dance from Wake Forest University, and a MA in Arts Administration from Columbia University. Throughout her studies, Ms. McDonald interned with numerous dance organizations including Dayton Contemporary Dance Company, Dayton Performing Arts Alliance, Boston Ballet School, The George Balanchine Trust, the New York Choreographic Institute at New York City Ballet, and The Joyce Theater. Ms. McDonald currently resides in New York City and works as the Operations Director for Gaynor Minden, an international pointe shoe and dancewear brand. In her free time, Ms. McDonald stays in touch with the choreographic process by supporting former Cunningham dancer Ellen Cornfield in the management of her modern dance company.

Barbara Pontecorvo (*Overture*) is originally from New Orleans, LA and studied there with Lelia Haller, a former Paris Opera Ballet dancer, and Mike Herrington. She joined Houston Ballet when she was 17, rose quickly through the ranks and attained Principal Dancer status when she was 21. She subsequently danced as a Principal Dancer with Chicago Ballet, Ballet Puertorequeno, Boston Repertory Ballet and Dayton Ballet. Barbara has choreographed many ballets and staged both full length classical ballets and with the permission of the Balanchine Trust, four Balanchine ballets. Her main focus is Pontecorvo Ballet Studios and her directorship of Gem City Ballet. Barbara has been married to David Shough for 34 years and lives in Carlisle, OH with two Great Danes, Don Q and Kitri.

Jonathan Tabbert (Shostakovich Dances) began his dance training at the Dayton Ballet School and then received a scholarship to study at The Harid Conservatory, where he was awarded a number of dance honors. In 1999 Jonathan completed his training at the School of the Hartford Ballet with supplemental training from the Houston Ballet Academy and American Ballet Theatre.

Jonathan had an illustrious performance career as a principal dancer with the Charleston Ballet Theatre as well as being a guest artist for Ballet Spartanburg, North Carolina State Ballet and the Greenville Ballet. After twelve years of being a valued staff member of the Charleston Ballet School he founded and directed their youth company. He also held the title of company teacher and guest choreographer. His choreography became a staple in the repertoire as well as receiving a performance grant from the Harkness Foundation for his ballet Jubilee. Other credits include Guest Teacher and/or Choreographer for the Gem City Ballet, Victoria Ballet Theatre, Burklyn Ballet Theatre and The Charleston County School of the Arts. During his time as resident choreographer for Palmetto City Ballet he has created numerous original repertory works and new classics including Little Match Girl, Creation, French Twist, Thumbelina, The Snow Queen and Cinderella. Jonathan is also currently the Co-Founder/Director of the Palmetto City Ballet School and Palmetto City Youth Ballet.
